
Séances 2-3: Contrasts and Dynamics: Exploring Johannesburg's Neighborhoods

Soweto - The Soul of South Africa

Description: Soweto (South Western Townships) was created during apartheid to separate black South Africans from white neighborhoods. Today it is vibrant, full of life and history. However, many inequalities remain.

Explain why Soweto is a symbol of South Africa's history and describe how it is changing today.

Sandton - Africa's Richest Square Mile

Description: Sandton is Johannesburg's modern business district, full of skyscrapers, luxury malls, banks, and five-star hotels. It shows wealth and success but also highlights urban inequalities.

Explore Sandton as a symbol of Johannesburg's wealth and modernization. Show how Sandton represents a new global image for the city, and think about the contrast with other areas.

Alexandra - Struggle and Survival

Description: Alexandra is one of the oldest and poorest townships, located next to rich Sandton. It struggles with overcrowding, informal housing, and unemployment, but shows strong community resilience.

Show how Alexandra reflects both poverty and resilience. What are the main problems faced by the people living there?
