

General task :

You are a member of the editorial board of the *New York Times*. You have to prepare the front page for Wednesday 9th May 1973 devoted to the end of the Wounded Knee occupation, in the Pine Ridge reservation. The different elements of the front page provide information about the revolt (causes, players, how it unfolded), and describe how the demands of the Amerindian populations emerged.

The *New York Times* was founded in 1851. It has become a leading national and international daily for its analysis and investigations. It still exists today.

Task layout :

- You will work in teams. You will need to divide the work between you to be efficient
- To help you in your research, you will be provided with web resources
- You will choose on the following websites a template to lay out your front page:

- The front page of your newspaper should look like one from the 1970s (typography of the newspaper's name, column layout, lead paragraphs)
- Information may come in the form of text (e.g. a short story or an interview), images (e.g. a photograph, drawing or cartoon) or a map. Each image must be titled and captioned. Each article must be titled
- The wording of the headlines, the choice of illustrations and the organisation of your front page must reflect your newspaper's editorial line and its context
