Objectives:

- Understand the reversal by American settlers of English values against their metropolis.
- Study the drafting context and issues of the Declaration of Independence.
- Analyze the influence of the French intervention in the American War of Independence

Problem: How did the United States come to be born from the challenge of the British model?

PART 1: THE BOSTON TEA PARTY (1773)
